



NNMD Board of Directors Meeting Summary

September 21, 2017

The Near Northwest Management District (NNMD) Board of Directors met in regular session on Thursday, September 21, 2017. The agenda included the following items:

- The District's financial status is strong and in good condition with four months remaining the year.
- The Board set the 2017 Assessment Rate at \$0.132 per \$100 value, the sixth year without a rate increase. \$15M in new construction and property reappraisals produced a 4.4% increase in appraised values. Given this growth and mindful of the impact of Hurricane Harvey on properties and of the proposed City of Houston one-time tax increase, the Board decided to maintain the current rate.
- The Board set the Public Hearing for November 27, 2017.
- Branding
 - The next five gateway markers are in the permit process.
- Economic and Business Development
 - The owners network meetings are bringing owners and managers together to compare concerns and identify issues. Speakers topics include energy use reduction incentive programs and crime reduction.
- White Oak Conference Center
 - The White Oak Pool remains open on weekends through October 1, 2017.
- Membership Committee
 - The Board appointed Elizabeth Castro Gray to fill the unexpired term of Position 5 after Director Gene Cripps resigned.
- Public Safety and Security
 - National Night Out, one of the largest in our area, will bring together law enforcement and public agencies, residents, and the business community on October 3rd. Our NNO will again be at White Oak Bayou Village Shopping Center at Antoine and W Little York.
